





STARTING.—In case of threatening or stormy weather, the committee reserve the right to postpone the Start until conditions are considered favourable.

Start at 6 a.m. cross line near Queenscliff Pier.

At 5.45 a.m. Preparatory Gun.

- " 5.55 a.m. Second Gun.
- " 6 a.m. Starting Gun.

The Guns will be fired from the fort by kind permission of the commandant.

Yachts may anchor or make harbour as often as they consider necessary. No time limit.

Finishing Line.—The Tamar Yacht Club, with the co-operation of the Harbour Master and the Lighthouse Keeper at Tamar Heads, have undertaken to take the times. The Finishing Point will be:—

DAY TIME.—A line between the Tamar Head Lighthouse and the Hebe Reef Buoy with leading marks in one.

NIGHT TIME.—Cross the red sector of light that shines from Tamar Heads Lighthouse on to the Hebe Reef Buoy with leading lights in one.

Before approaching red sector at night, each Yacht must burn a Roman Candle to draw attention, and after crossing shall burn a Blue Light in such a way as to show her number on peak of mainsail, then sail into Pilot Station and report. Captain Evans of the Pilot Station will pilot any yachts to Georgetown, where a comfortable anchorage will be found.

All Yachts must be ready for inspection at Queenscliff on Christmas Day.

Number to be carried on both sides of sail on Yacht.
