### **SUPPLEMENTARY SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

(To be read in conjunction with Alpha Course Season 2018/19 Sailing Instructions.

#### **1. ELIGIBILITY**

- 1.1 Entry will be accepted from boats that have lodged a completed declaration of compliance with AS Safety Requirements, **Category 5N**, plus the following additional equipment:
- (a) Jackstays – Item 4.03.1
  - (b) Flashlights – Item 4.06.2
  - (c) Spare Compass – Item 3.21.2
  - (d) Hand held G.P.S. or better.
  - (e) Safety Harnesses and Safety Lines (Tethers) – Item 5.02
- 1.2 Boats wishing to race shall notify RGYC reception prior to 1700hrs Friday 5<sup>th</sup> April 2019

#### **2. SAFETY**

##### Crew Declarations

- (a) The owner or delegate shall submit a Crew Declaration containing
  - The boats name
  - The sail number
  - The given name, surname and membership status (or receipt number) of each person aboard.
- (b) Crew Declarations shall be lodged electronically by downloading and lodging a declaration through the 'Memberpoint App', **PRIOR TO RACING**. If crew do not have RGYC membership, or a current day-pass for that day, a day-pass can also be obtained through the 'Memberpoint App', prior to being available for selection as crew.
- (c) Cadet members shall have written permission from their parents or guardian to take part in the race and submit this to the skipper before departure. Owner/skippers having Cadet Members on board shall be responsible for their well being at all times.
- (d) Boats failing to comply with SSI 2 (a) and 2 (b) shall be scored "DID NOT START" (DNS) without a hearing. This changes RRS A4, A5 and 63.1

#### **3. RULES**

- 3.1 The International Regulations for the Prevention of Collision at Sea will replace Part 2 of the World Sailing Racing Rules of Sailing between the official times of sunset and sunrise.
- 3.2 Where there is a conflict between the Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions the Sailing Instructions shall prevail.

#### **4. THE START**

As described in the Supplementary Sailing Instructions for Club Courses.

#### **5. FINISH**

The finishing line will be between the staff displaying an orange flag at the Signal Box and the Yellow Speed Zone Mark to the West of the Signal Box. Boats shall cross the finishing line in a generally Southerly direction, leaving the North Cardinal Mark (near the north west corner of the Marina) to PORT.

This changes RRS Appendix S 11.1

**Boats shall record their own finishing time and lodge with log.** (Time to be taken from GPS)

## **6. THE COURSE:**

- 6.1 The course shall consist of the Club Course for the day and the course shown on the log sheet (below).
- 6.2 Boats shall pass through the Club Course finish line as a gate before proceeding on the Gannet Cup course.
- 6.3 The table included in the log (below) contains the order in which marks are to be rounded and the side on which each mark is to be left. **WGS 84 chart datum** has been used to determine the approximate position of each mark.

**Competitors are reminded to avoid all marine farms (culture spat collection zones) and should make themselves familiar with the location of all such farms prior to sailing.**

## **7. LOGS**

Boats shall submit a log on the form attached. Logs are to be lodged, either at the RGYC Office, or by fax to (03)5223 2768, or by email to [sailing@rgyc.com.au](mailto:sailing@rgyc.com.au) no later than the close of protest time. The minimum requirement shall be an entry at each mark of the course.

Boats failing to submit a satisfactory log will be scored DNF without a hearing. This changes RRS, 63.1, A4 and A5

## **8. HANDICAPS**

The handicaps for this race MAY differ to those for the Saturday Aggregate.

## **9. TIME LIMIT**

- 9.1 The time limit for boats to sail the course and finish is 1200 hours Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> April 2019. If no boat has sailed the course and finished within the time limit the race shall be abandoned.
- 9.2 Any boats still racing when the time limit expires will be scored TLE as per 2018/19 Alpha Supplementary Sailing Instruction 11(b). This changes RRS 35, A4.2 and A5

## **10. PROTESTS and REQUESTS FOR REDRESS**

The protest time limit is 1200 hours, Monday 8<sup>th</sup> April 2019.

## **11. RADIO COMMUNICATION**

- 11.1 Boats shall notify the Race Committee Vessel or the Race Officer at the completion of the Club Course portion of the race of their intention to continue. [DP]
- 11.2 Boats are requested to monitor VHF channels 16 and channel 71 during the race.
- 11.3 Boats retiring from the race are requested to notify the Race Officer via mobile phone 0418 520 662 ASAP after retiring and state their intentions. [DP]

## **12. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY**

- 12.1. Competitors participate in this event entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race.
- 12.2. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the event.
